For the final exam you are to write a well-reasoned (argued) essay in which you will <u>develop a thesis</u> and utilize examples from the class text "Night" to support your argument and selected quotes and/or passages. You must use quotes/passages from the text, followed by <u>your own analysis</u> to back up your thesis/ideas/argument. Your essay MUST be an analysis and not simply a summary of the novel. <u>This is not the place to summarize the text</u>. Instead, you are to establish a thesis and then back it up with support from the text and then <u>analyze</u> the passages by discussing/showing how it applies and supports your thesis.

## Your task is as follows:

Develop a 5-paragrapah essay around the topic of *guilt and inaction* by developing it into a THEME.

- 1. Brainstorm first.
- 2. Develop the topic into a well-constructed theme, following all the strategies you have learned this year concerning theme development.
- 3. Look for direct quotes or passages from the novel *Night* by using the novel itself or by using your DEJ. You will then incorporate these into your essay. You should have a minimum of 3 direct quotes but no more than six.
- 4. One you have developed your <u>THEME</u> you should incorporate it into your thesis and then begin writing your essay and show how this theme runs throughout the entire memoir.
- 5. Do not forget to analyze each direct quote and show how/why this quote supports your theme. It should be 25% direct quotes and 75% analysis.

## The layout:

- 1. Begin your introduction by first giving a very short summary of the novel and include the title, as well as the author's full name and then construct a thesis in which you address the topic of *guilt and inaction* by developing it into a theme. This will be your first paragraph,
- 2. Your three body paragraphs will be constructed as follows: Identify and support your thesis with quotes and passages from the text followed by analysis. Select THREE main events and/or issues in the text where GUILT and INACTION plays in role throughout Wiesel's and the other Jews' experience in the Holocaust. Each event/issue you select must be supported by direct quotes from the text, followed by your analysis. You may use additional support from other films or texts that we read/viewed in class.
- 3. Conclude by restating your thesis and main points and ending with a philosophical point you want to make concerning the novel as a whole. There should be absolutely NO NEW POINTS in the conclusion.
- 4. Don't forget to add a heading to your essay.

5. Don't forget to follow MLA format by adding page numbers in the upper right-hand corner.

## **Format:**

- 1. Your essay MUST be written in <u>3<sup>rd</sup> person</u> or the highest grade you may receive is a "D."
- 2. Your essay must be written in **PRESENT TENSE** or the highest grade you may receive is a "D."
- 3. You must include a minimum of THREE quotes from the text WITH ANALYSIS or the highest grade you can receive is a "D." Three quotes is the minimum and six is the maximum. Every quote/passage must be followed by YOUR ANALYSIS where you make it clear, through discussion, why you chose that quote/passage to support your thesis. Answer the SO WHAT? Remember the 25/75% rule.
- 4. For your citations please use only MLA formatting. Ex. (357).
- 5. When your essay exam is complete, submit to turnitin.com PRIOR to the deadline.
