#### **#4 – Garden Arrangement for Mom’s Day.**

You will pick up flowers from a store, farmers market, make artificial flowers or use repurposed /recycled materials from your home or product from your yard.

1. Get permission to pick flowers/greens/succulents from your yard, neighbor’s yard, or other locations.
2. Review our identification classifications (Line, Form, Filler, Mass, Foliage) and resources about plant materials to develop an idea about how much and what to then select and cut flowers, greens and/or succulents. Look up some ideas for bouquet shapes in your text book or from google.
3. Select a container from repurposed items and try to picture the size and shape of the piece in your mind before you get started.
4. Create bouquet. (Focus on Color and Shape when deciding how to build your arrangement. (Use the materials to their best use or the right material in the best way. Keep stems as long as possible for line, etc. )
5. Photograph your piece and submit with short description including design shape, colors, and possible use of the arrangement (Where you will put it in your home and how best to keep it fresh longer). (Identify plant material, type of container, source of materials, and your feelings.)



The final arrangement does not have to be exactly as the design plan you had pictured in your head in the beginning.... maybe you use less materials than you cut from your yard or change your idea as you felt it. Finally, a paragraph description of your experience making the arrangement; good, bad, challenging, fun, etc. I would like to hear how your Mom liked it?? Did the arrangement work to send the message you wanted? Good Luck!

#### **#5 - Final Year in Reflection Due May 15th**

You will be using some think time to mental review all the projects we have done this year. Then complete a Final Portfolio Reflection assignment that is 1 page long, preferably typed.
