

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FIRST YEAR ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

1. Minimum of 15 yearlong high school courses ("a-g")

a.	History/social science	2 years required
b.	English	4 years required
C.	Mathematics	3 years required/ 4 years recommended
d.	Laboratory science	2 years required/ 3 years recommended
e.	Language other than English	2 years required/ 3 years recommended
f.	Visual and performing arts	1 year required
g.	College-preparatory elective	1 year required

- 2. UC-calculated GPA of 3.0 or above (nonresident: 3.4)
- 3. ACT with Writing or SAT with Essay

TELL US IN YOUR OWN WORDS

- You will have 8 questions to choose from.
- You only need to respond to 4 of the 8 questions.
- Each response is limited to 350 words.
- Which questions you choose to answer is entirely up to you, but you should select questions that are most relevant to your experience and that best reflect your individual circumstances.

- 1. Describe an example of your leadership experience in which you have positively influenced others, helped resolve disputes, or contributed to group efforts over time.
- 2. Every person has a creative side, and it can be expressed in many ways: problem solving, original and innovative thinking, and artistically, to name a few. Describe how you express your creative side.

3. What would you say is your greatest talent or skill? How have you developed and demonstrated that talent over time?

4. Describe how you have taken advantage of a significant educational opportunity or worked to overcome an educational barrier you have faced.

5. Describe the most significant challenge you have faced and the steps you have taken to overcome this challenge. How has this challenge affected your academic achievement?

6. Think about an academic subject that inspires you. Describe how you have furthered this interest inside and/or outside of the classroom.

- 7. What have you done to make your school or your community a better place?
- 8. Beyond what has already been shared in your application, what do you believe makes you stand out as a strong candidate for admissions to the University of California?

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APPLYING FOR ADMISSION

Aug. 1

Fall admission application available

Nov. 1-30

Submit application for the fall semester

July 1-31

Submit application for the spring semester

- One application to apply to all nine undergraduate campuses
- Application fee: \$70 per campus (\$80 for international)
- Fee waivers are available to students who qualify

AFTER YOU APPLY

- Print a copy of your application
- Take required tests by December of your senior year
- Research and apply for scholarships
- Apply for financial aid by March 2
 (FAFSA or CA Dream Act Application)
- Order test score reports
- Update your application
- Await your admission decision

How to Apply for Financial Aid

- Apply for admission to UC Merced by Nov. 30
- Submit FAFSA or CA Dream Act Application by March 2
- Submit Cal Grant GPA Verification Form by March 2
- Complete and return any documents requested by the Office of Financial Aid and Scholarships by June 1


New first year students are required to live on campus for two years, unless they qualify for a residency exemption waiver.
