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# ART TASK #1: Color Wheel

### **Directions:**

Objective: In this task, you are going to create a flower color wheel.

### Steps:

I) Draw the center of the flower. Add line designs in it.


2) Add a petal on the top, bottom, and sides of the flower's center.

3) Add petals in the remaining spaces around the flower.

4) Draw a stem and a leaf.

5) Color the flower petals exactly as seen in the example with your choice of mediums. Color red and green as opposites, blue and orange as opposites, and yellow and purple as opposites.


6) Color the background with your choice of color.




The Color Wheel:

There are 12 main colors on the color wheel. In the RGB color wheel, these hues are red, orange, yellow, chartreuse green, green, spring green, cyan, azure, blue, violet, magenta and rose. The color wheel can be divided into primary, secondary and tertiary colors.

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# ART TASK #2: Primary Colors


### **Directions:**

**Objective:** In this task, you are going to create an art piece that explores only using the PRIMARY COLORS in a RADIAL DESIGN.

#### Steps:

I) Pick an object that you want to draw. Draw it on the top, bottom and sides of the paper, as seen in the example.


2) Draw the same object in the in between spaces. This will make a radial design.
3) Pick one Primary Color (Red, Yellow, or Blue) to color the background with.
4) Use the remaining two primary colors to color the objects you drew in a radial design, as seen in the example.




#### Primary Colors:

Primary colors include red, blue and yellow. Primary colors cannot be mixed from other colors. They are the source of all other colors.

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### ART TASK # ?: Secondary Colors

### **Directions:**

**Objective:** In this task, you are going to create an art piece by tracing objects you have around you and then coloring the image with secondary colors.

### Steps:


I) Find objects and place them on your paper.

2) Trace around your objects with a black, brown, blue, or purple coloring medium.

3) Take off the objects.

4) Use a ruler and draw lines across your paper in differnt angles.

5) Color each section with one of the secondary colors: orange, purple, and green. Try and create a mosaic of secondary colors.





### Secondary Colors:

Secondary colors are mixed from two primary colors adjacent to each other on the color wheel.

The secondary colors are orange, green and violet.

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# ART TASK #4: Neutral Colors


### **Directions:**

### Steps:

- I) Draw your owl's head.
- 2) Draw the body and the face.
- 3) Add the remaining details of the owl. Add your own choice details as well.


4) Color your owl and the background only using Neutral Colors in your choice of medium: black, white, gray, brown, and beige.




#### Neutral Colors:

Neutral colors don't usually show up on the color wheel. Neutral colors include black, white, gray, and sometimes brown and beige. They are sometimes called "earth tones."

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
# ART TASK #5: Cool Colors

### **Directions:**

**Objective**: In this task, you are going to create an art piece of a bunny silhouette that explores cool colors.

### Steps:


- I) Draw your bunny's ears and head.
- 2) Draw the body and feet.
- 3) Draw grass and other things around the environment.
- 4) Color the bunny black and the ground with gray with your choice of mediums.
- 5) Color the background with cool colors: blue, green, and purple.




### Cool Colors:

Cool colors are typified by blue, green, and light purple. They can calm and soothe. Where warm colors remind you of heat and sunshine, cool colors remind you of water and sky, even ice and snow.

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

**Objective:** In this task, you are going to create a train art piece that only uses warm colors.




- I) Draw your train following the steps.

### Warm Colors:

Warm colors consist of orange, red, yellow, and combinations of these and similar colors. As the name indicates, they tend to make you think of warm things, such as sunlight and heat.

## **Directions**:

**Objective:** In this task, you are going to create an art piece that is inspired by Monet's Lilies that uses cool colors.


### Steps:


- I) Draw the lily pad. Draw the first two petals of your flower.


# ART TASK #8: Shading

**Objective:** In this task, you are going to create an art piece that explores shading a goldfish in a fish bowl.


### Steps:


- I) Draw the top of the fish bowl.

### What is a Shadow?

A shadow is a dark area where light from a light source is blocked by an opaque object. It occupies all of the three-dimensional volume behind an object with light in front of it.






## ART TASK #9: Rainbow Kitty

### Steps:


- I) Draw the kitty's head.

- 5) Color your kitty and the background with your choice of colors.




### The Colors of a Rainbow:
