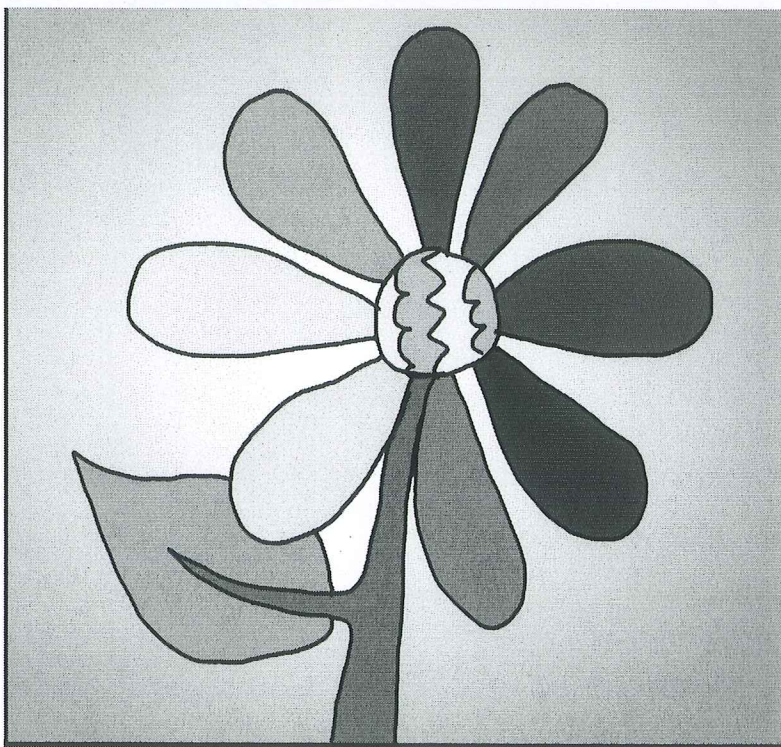
# ART TASK #1: Color Wheel

## Directions:

**Objective:** In this task, you are going to create a flower color wheel.

### Steps:

- 1) Draw the center of the flower. Add line designs in it.

- 6) Color the background with your choice of color.



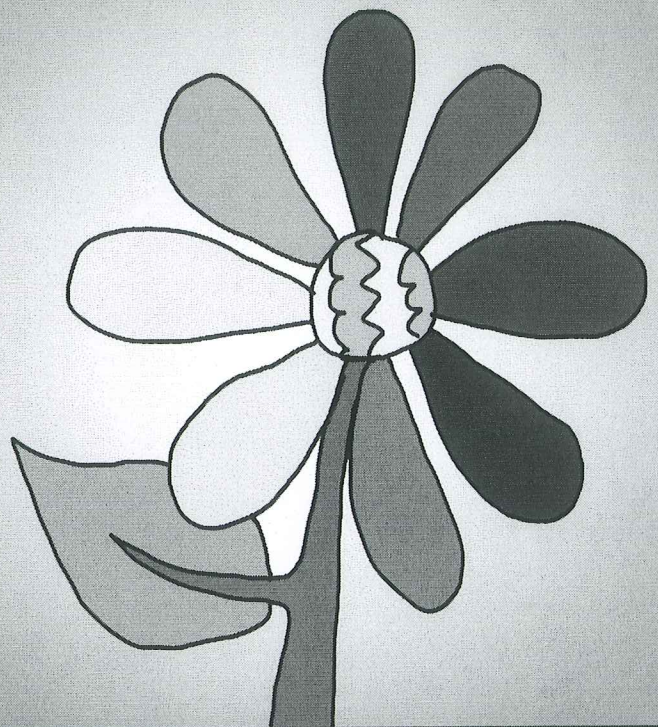
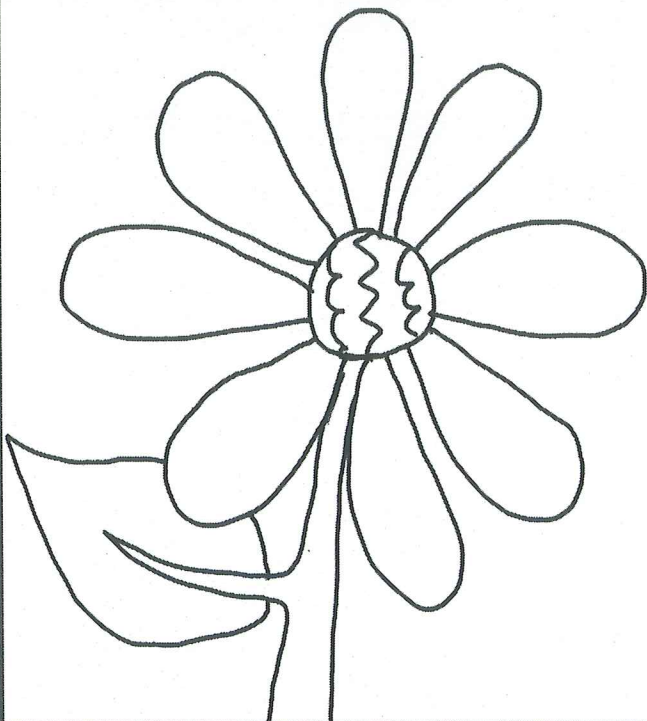
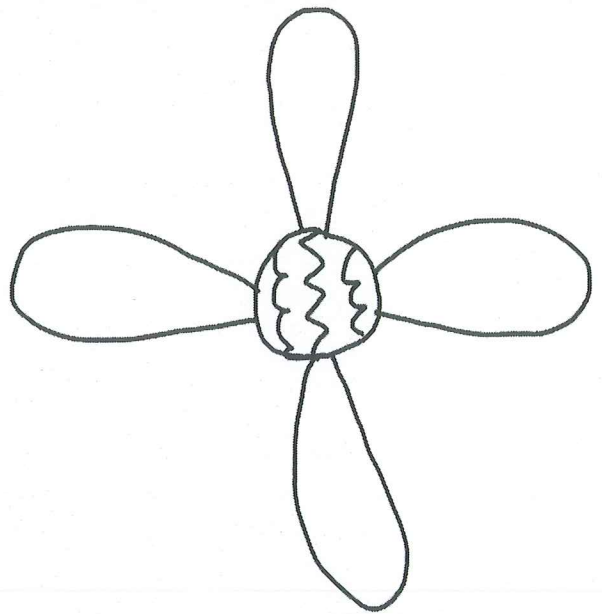
### The Color Wheel:

There are 12 main colors on the color wheel. In the RGB color wheel, these hues are red, orange, yellow, chartreuse green, green, spring green, cyan, azure, blue, violet, magenta and rose. The color wheel can be divided into primary, secondary and tertiary colors.

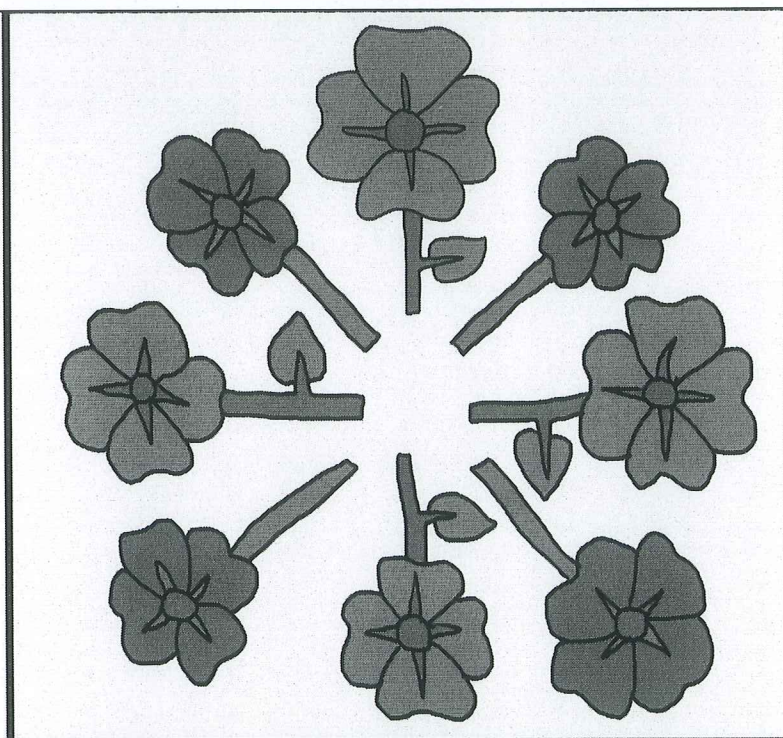
# ART TASK #2: Primary Colors

- 4) Use the remaining two primary colors to color the objects you drew in a radial design, as seen in the example.



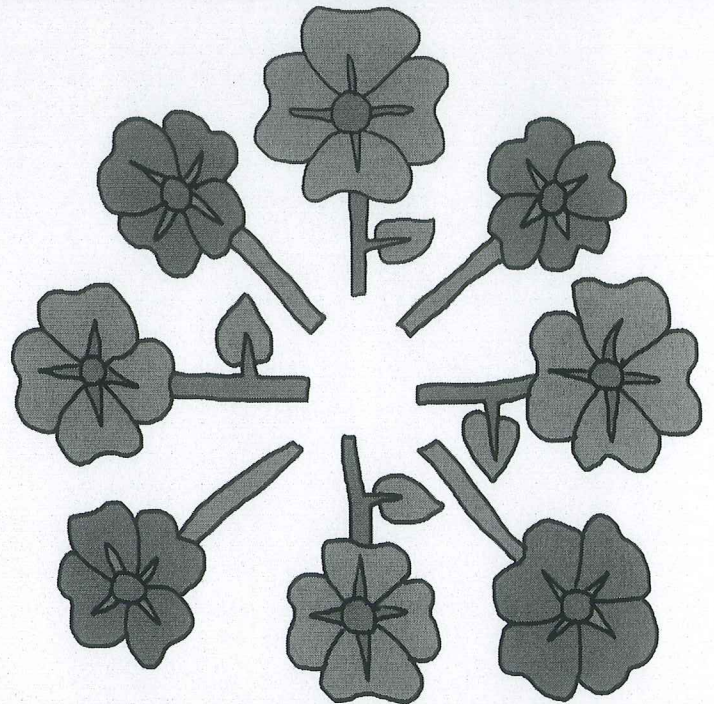
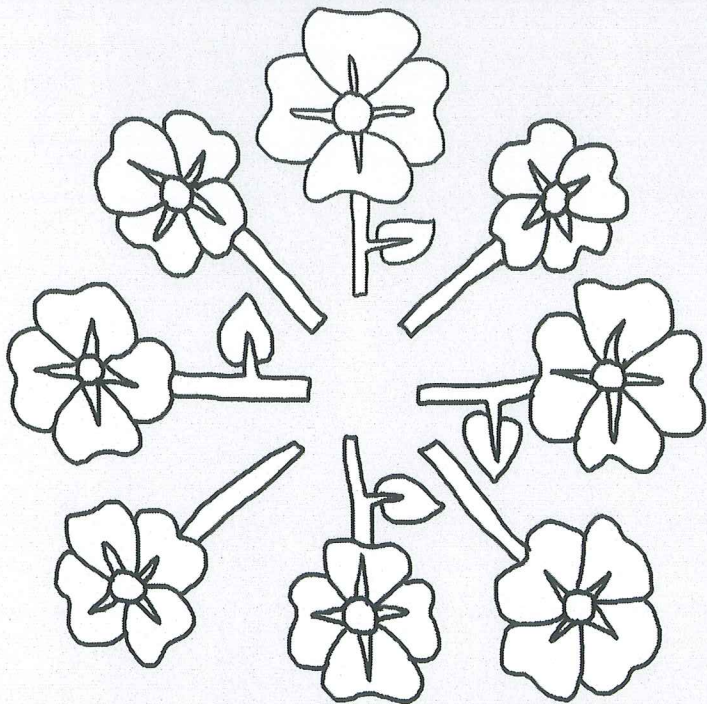
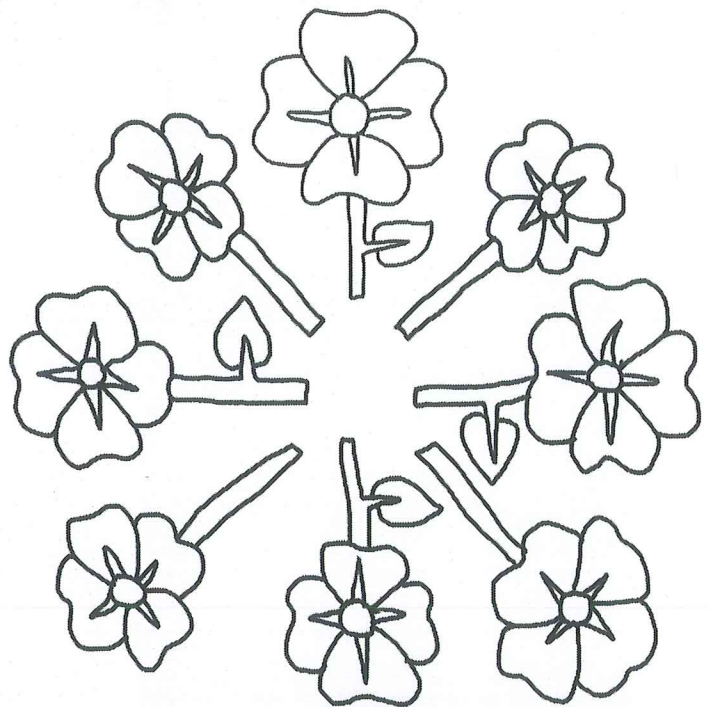
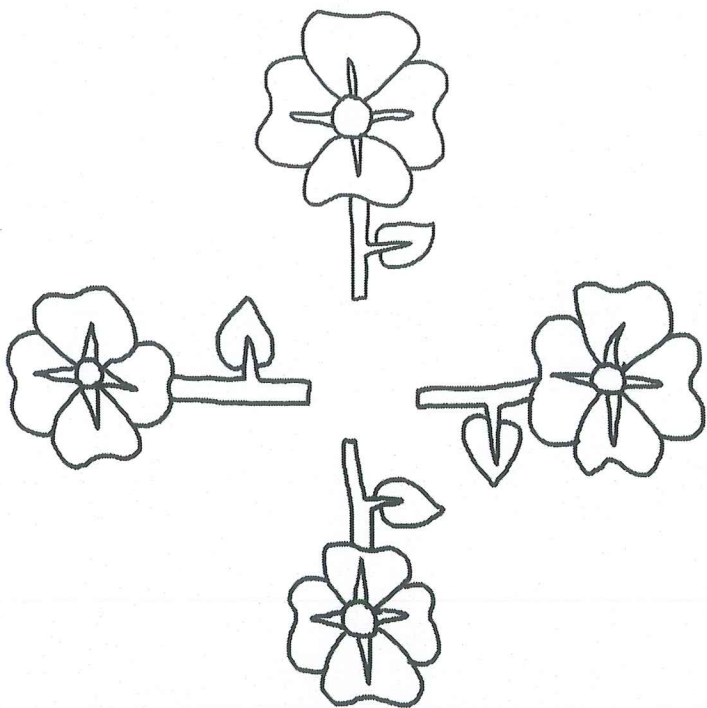
### Primary Colors:

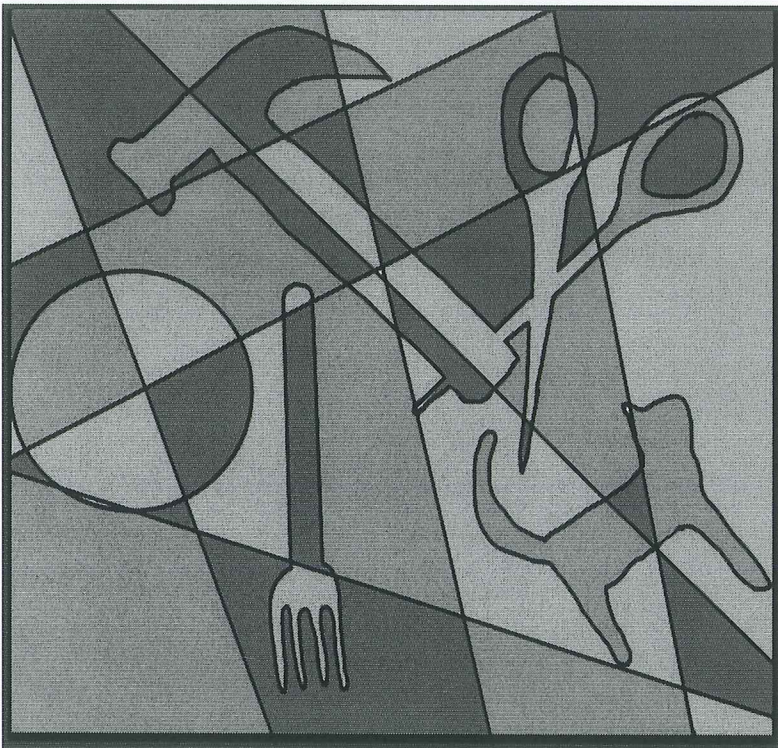
## Secondary Colors

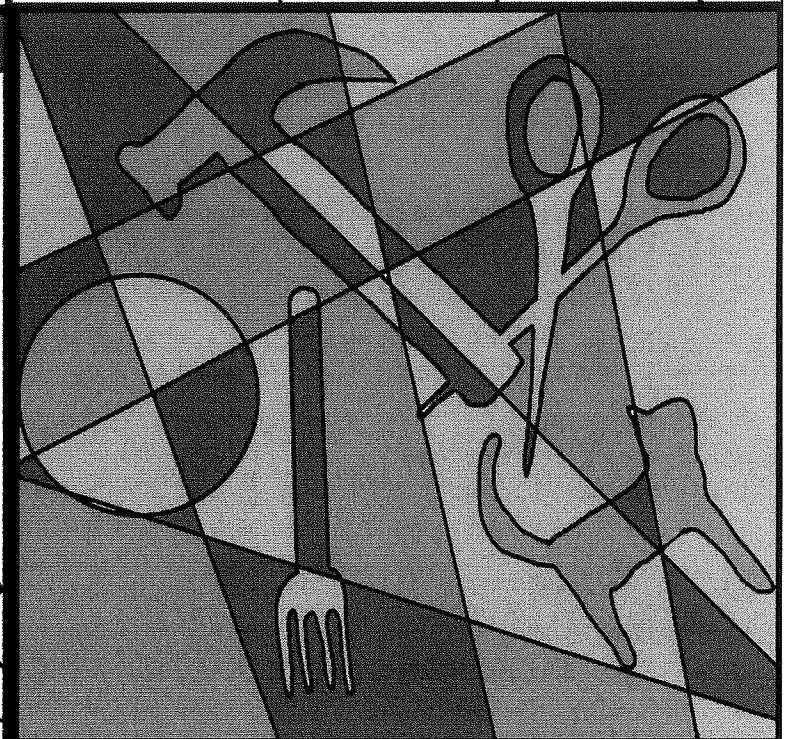
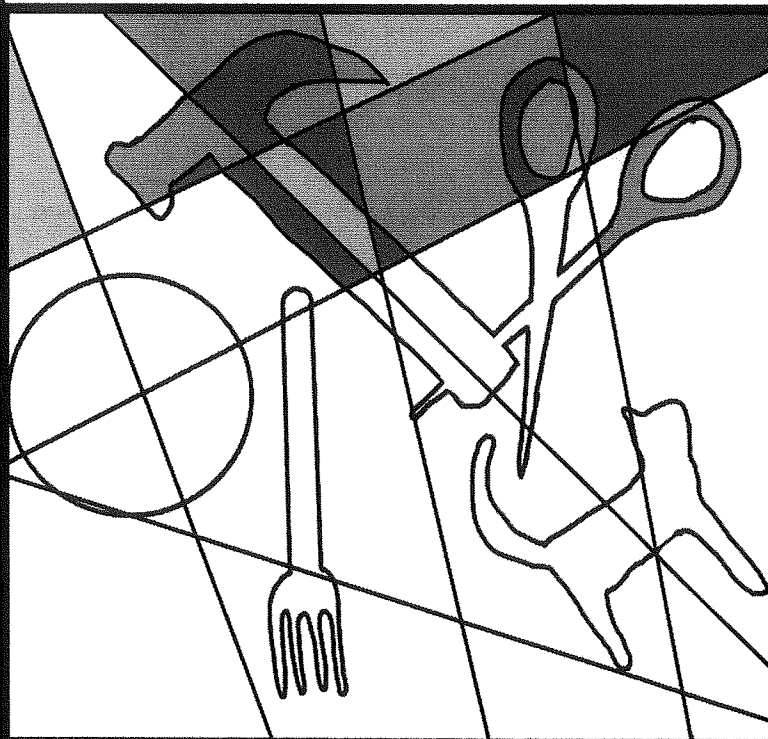
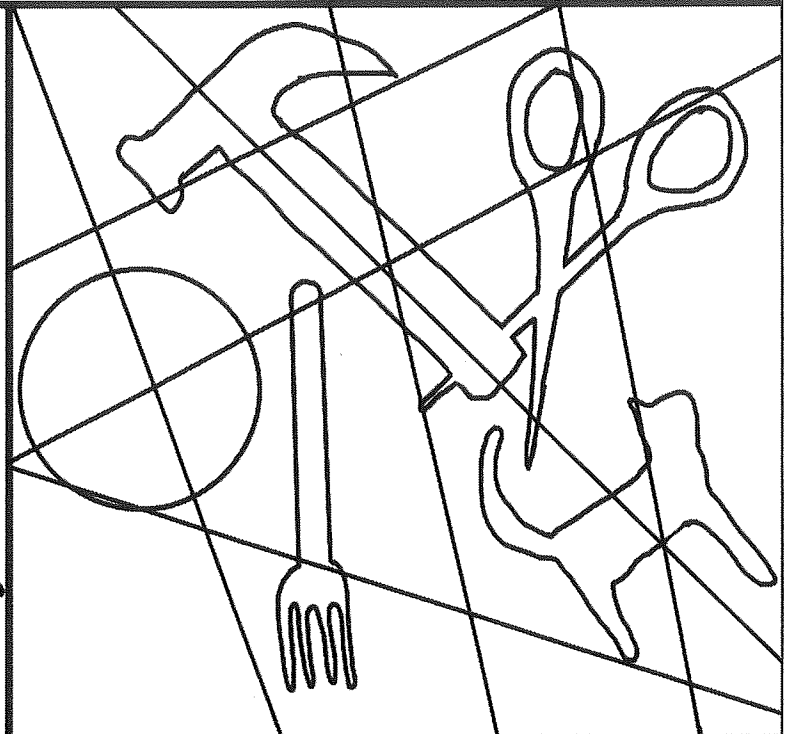
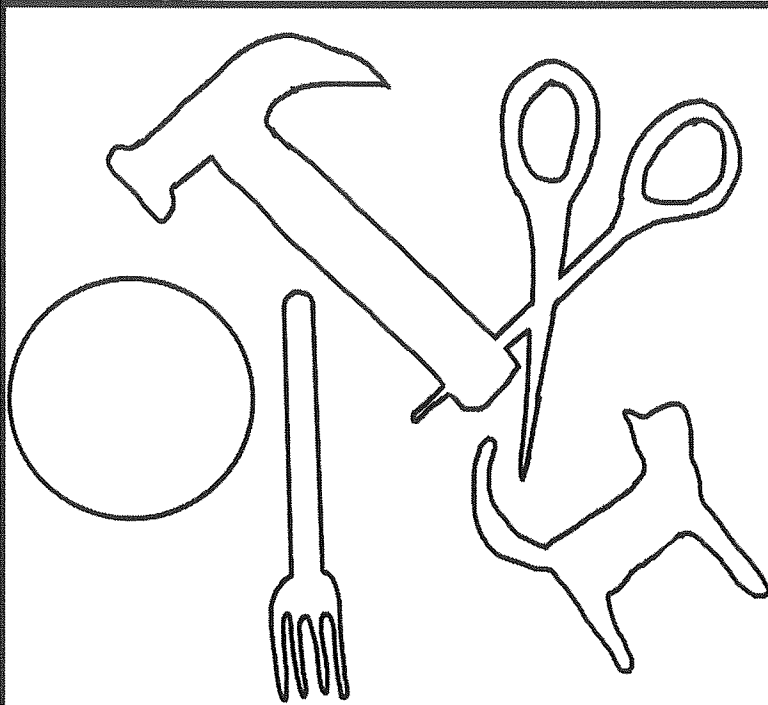
Secondary colors are mixed from two primary colors adjacent to each other on the color wheel.

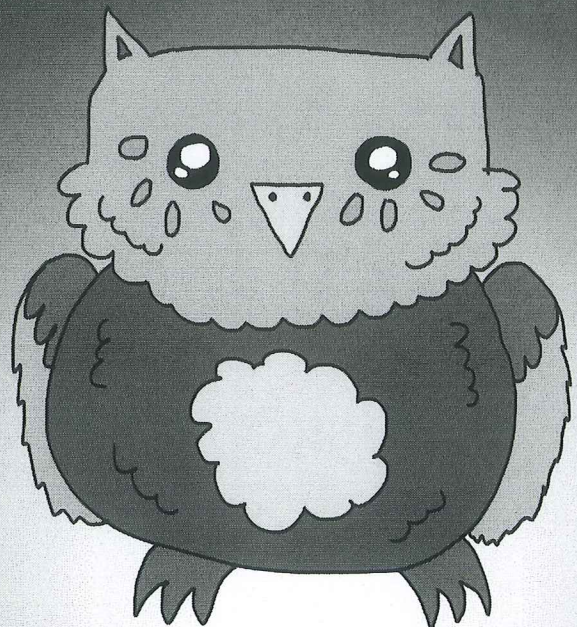
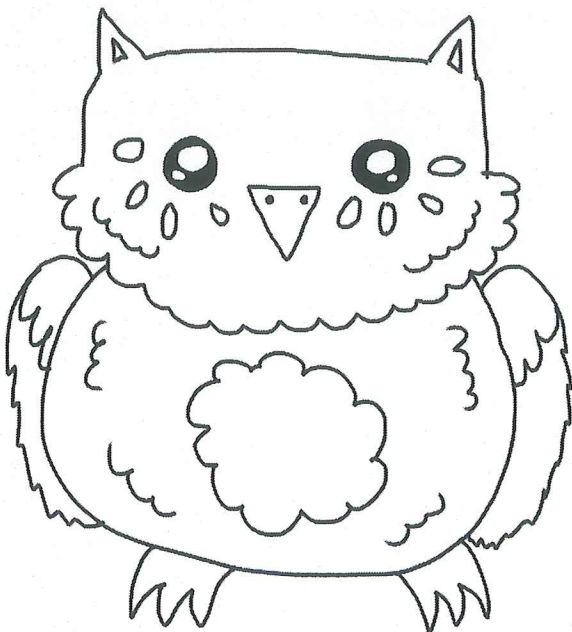
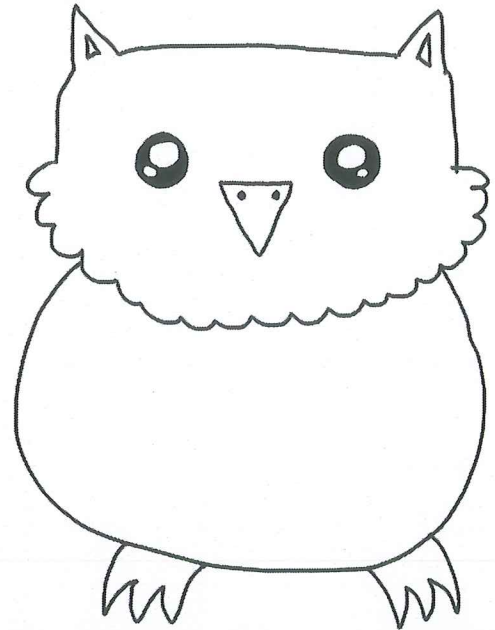
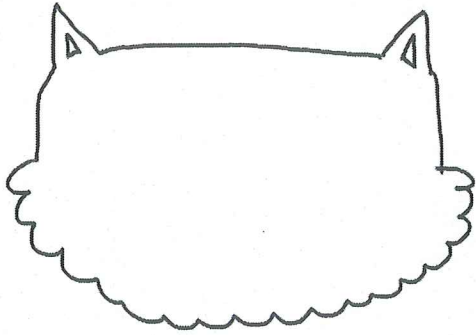
### Neutral Colors:

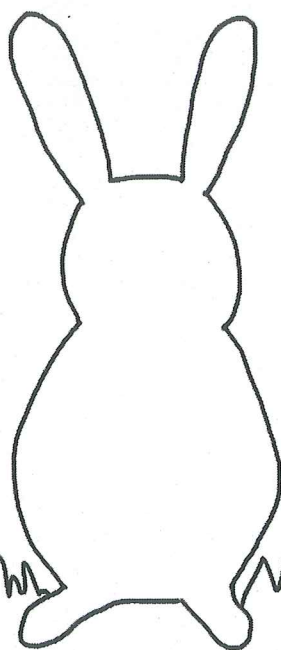
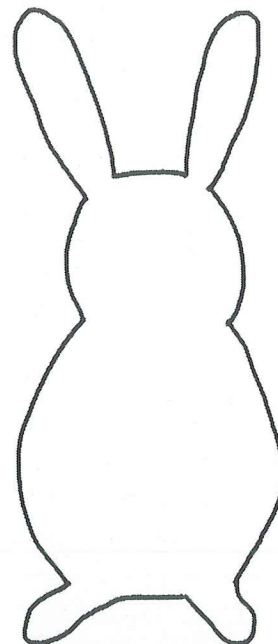
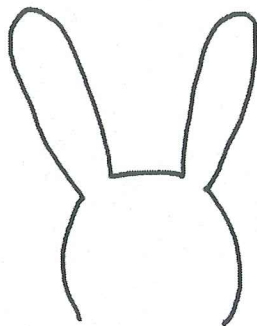
### Cool Colors:

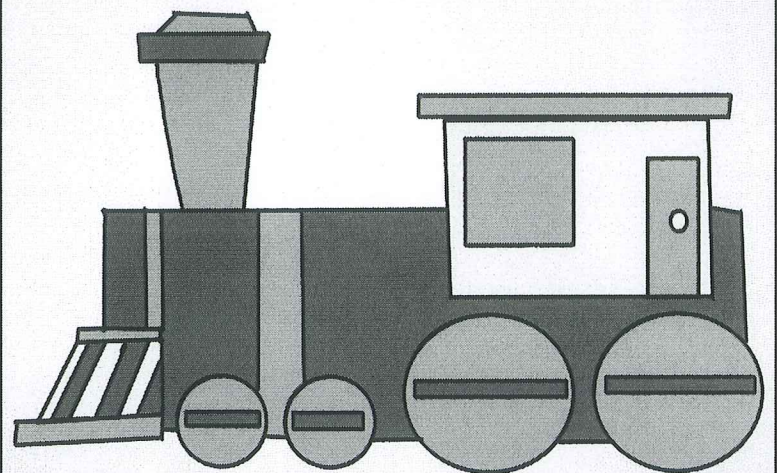
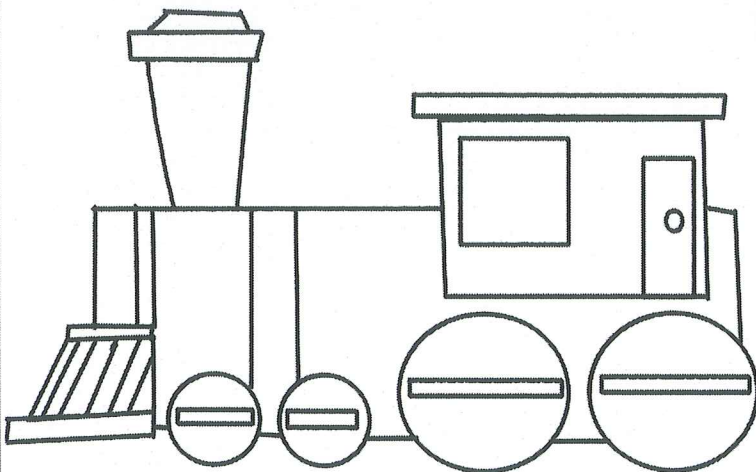
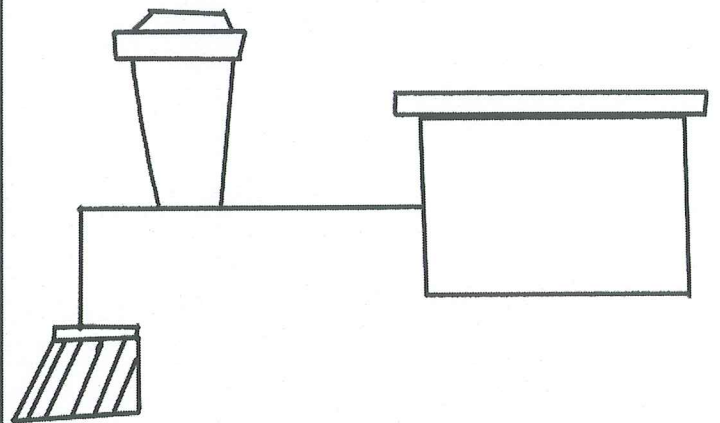
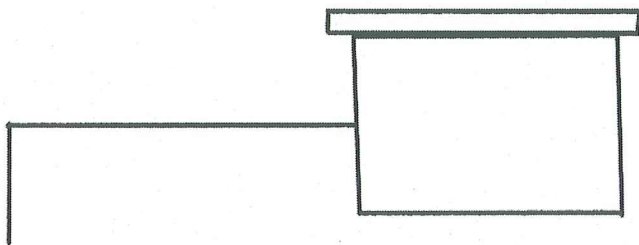
### Warm Colors:

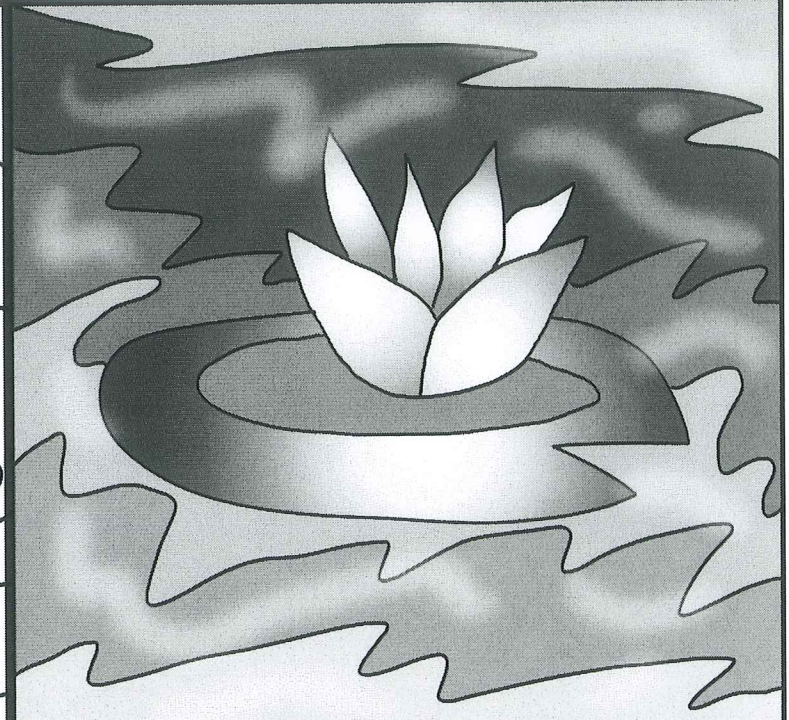
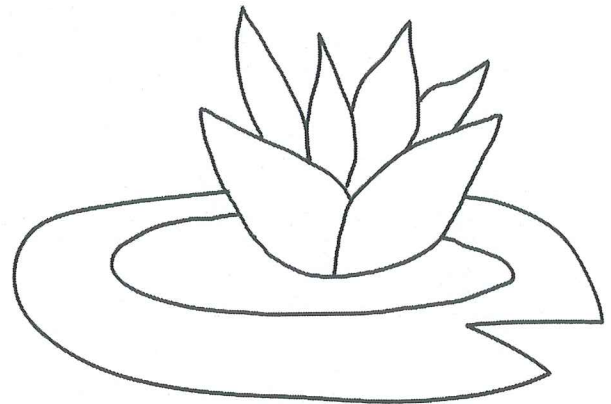
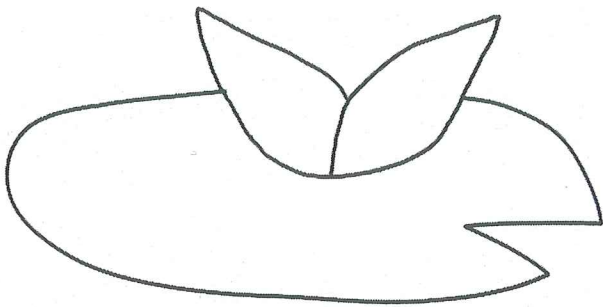
### Monet Lilies

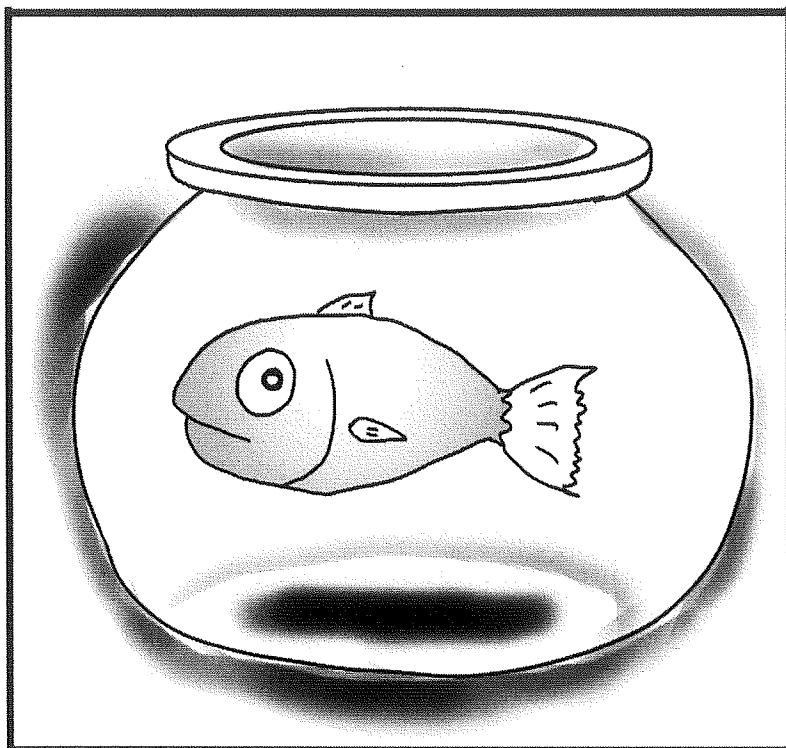

- 5) Use a black art medium to lightly color around the sides of the fish bowl. Color the bottom of the bowl and create a shadow of a fish. Follow the example.



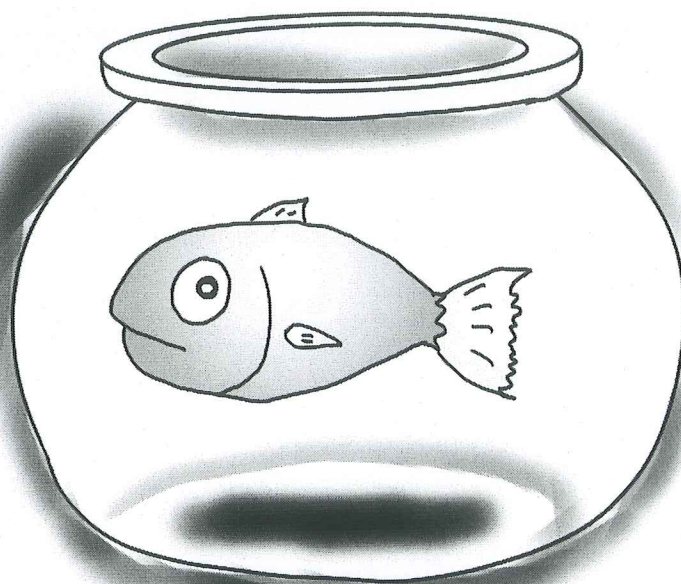
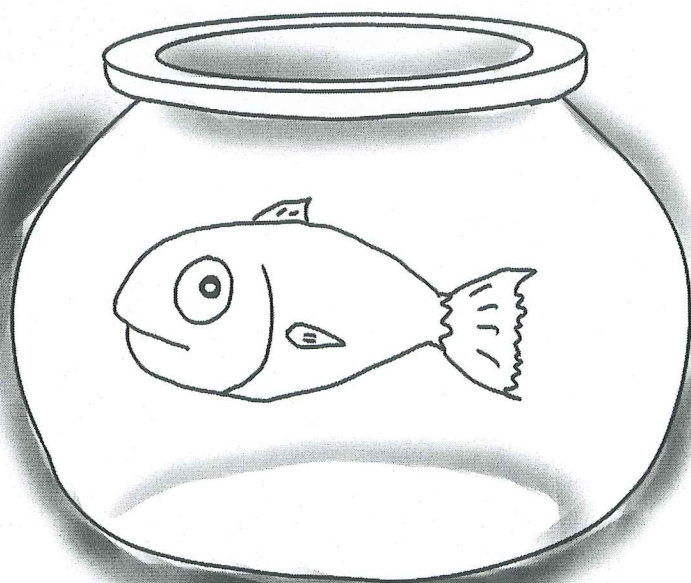
### What is a Shadow?

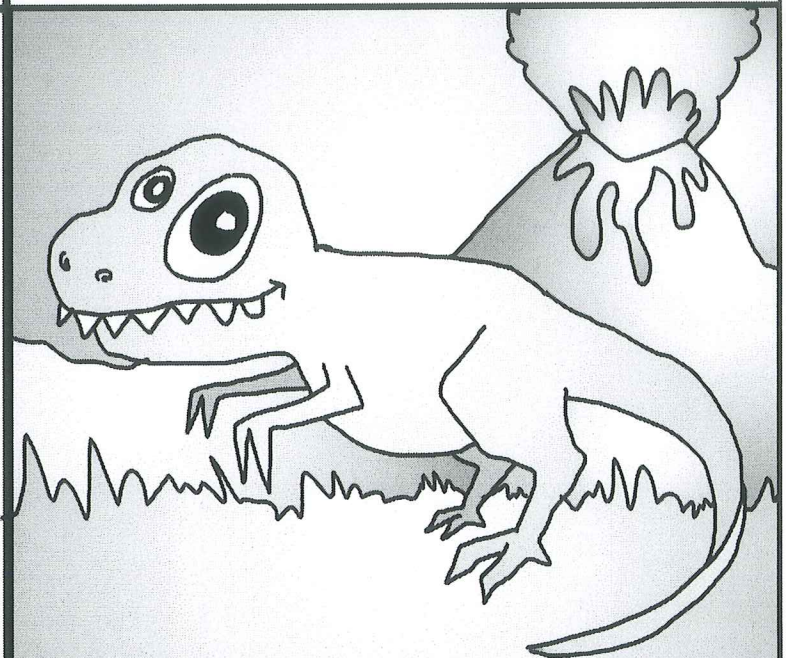
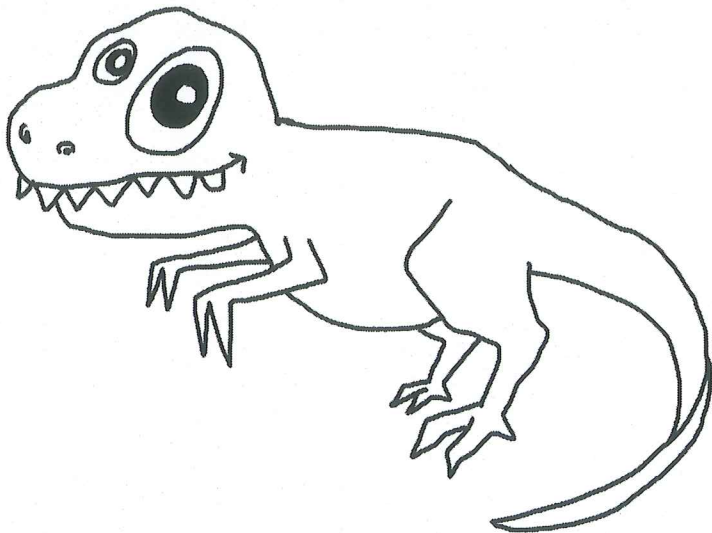
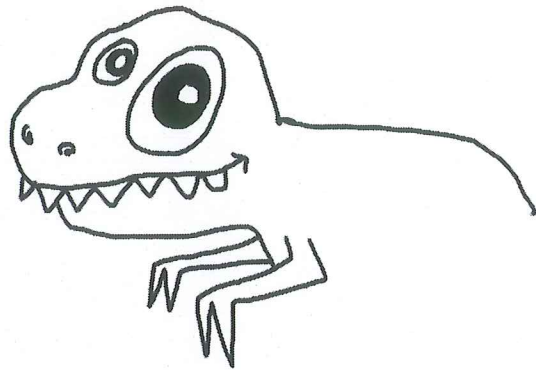
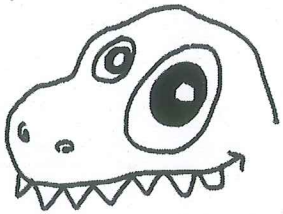
### Dinosaur Facts
