## **How Students Get SAT or ACT Fee Waivers:**

SAT fee waivers <u>are not automatically provided</u> to students. School counselors identify first-time fee waiver eligible students at their school and distribute fee waivers to them through the Career Center Technician. See the box below. <u>Note: Students who've already tested with a fee waiver will automatically have their full set of fee waiver benefits in their College Board account. A fee waiver number is only issued once to a student.</u>

## **College Application Fee Waivers:**

College Board provides college application fee waivers directly to a student's College Board account for students who took an SAT using a fee waiver. Eligible juniors will get college application fee waivers in the fall of their senior year. ACT also offers a College Application fee waiver process. Refer to the ACT Fee Waiver brochure for further information.

To receive a fee waiver at West High, students need to bring in a copy of the letter received from TUSD Food services showing they are approved for free or reduced lunch for the current school year to the Career Center. If you are eligible through another requirement (see below), please speak with the Career Center Technician directly.

## Are You Eligible?

SAT and ACT fee waivers are available to low-income 11th and 12th grade students in the U.S. or U.S. territories.

You're eligible for fee waivers if you say "yes" to any of the following:

- You're enrolled in or eligible and approved to participate in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP).
- Your annual family income falls within the Income Eligibility Guidelines set by the USDA Food and Nutrition Service.
- You're enrolled in a federal, state, or local program that aids students from low-income families (e.g., Federal TRIO programs such as Upward Bound).
- Your family receives public assistance.
- You live in federally subsidized public housing or a foster home, or are homeless.
- You are a ward of the state or an orphan.

## **ACT Fee Waiver:**

Paper ACT Fee Waivers are available through the Career Center. See the Career Center Technician to obtain a fee waiver for the ACT. Same process applies as stated in the box above.
