APPLICATIONS ACCEPTED April 1st - May 17th, 2021 or Until Class is Full

Are you nearing the end of high school and thinking about attending college?

Do you have a plan to transition successfully through this major change in your educational journey?

Make the shift with TASK.



TASK is a two-week learning community designed to assist 30 students as they transition from high school to college. The intensive orientation provided through TASK will help students build the knowledge and skills necessary to successfully achieve their academic goals at Delta College.

Students will enroll in two courses: *Learning Skills 72 (LS 72 - 1 unit course): Transition for Academic Success* and *Counseling 11 (COUN 11 formerly GUID 11 - .5 unit course): New Student Orientation*. Courses are scheduled to meet, **Monday through Thursday, June 7th through 17th, 8:30 a.m. to 11:45 a.m. with no classes on Fridays.**

- ☞ Students with an IEP, 504 Plan, and/or Psych Evaluation are eligible to participate.
- ☞ Program includes:
 - *How to access disability-related services at the college level.
 - *How to understand an academic accommodation plan and communicate it to an instructor.
 - *Exploring Delta College's support services and academic resources.
- ☞ Priority consideration will be given to five students from each of the following high school districts: Stockton, Lincoln, Lodi, Manteca, and Tracy. Students from other districts may be considered.
